Unapproved Tree Removal

Unfortunately, there have been recent instances unapproved tree removal within our community. While the Association makes every effort to accommodate homeowner requests, there are instances in which it is not appropriate to approve the removal of trees. Trees provide aesthetic appeal to our community, provide necessary buffers between properties in many instances, play an important visual role



in streetscapes, and oftentimes play an integral role in the overall landscaping of a Lot. As a reminder, the Towne Lake Hills Community Association fine policy for unapproved tree removal is as follows:


Any homeowner who removes, or allows to be removed, trees without obtaining pre-approval by from the Towne

Hills Architectural Lake Control Committee Article VII Section 13 of the Protective Declaration of Covenants, will be subject to an immediate \$250.00 fine. Further, the Association, in certain instances, may assess additional fines in excess of the \$250.00 initial fine based on the nature of the violation, addition possible remediation (installation of new trees) and all other

enforcement remedies afforded the Association by Article XV of the Protective Covenants.

Choosing Paint Colors for your Home

ACC and HOA Board

n order to help guide the exterior paint approval process, an approved Paint Palette Book (PPB) of colors for the exterior of our homes has been created for our Towne Lake Hills (TLH) Neighborhoods. It will be accessible during normal business hours and may be viewed, copied, or photographed but may not be removed from the office of Sixes Management Group, located upstairs in the TLH Clubhouse. Additionally, a copy of the book, with representative samples is available on our web site. However, these may be helpful

but they cannot represent the exact hue or color of actual products being applied. It would be advisable to go to the Sherwin Williams store, across from the Aspen Carwash on Bells Ferry and ask for chip samples of the exact color for better viewing. These paint chips can be matched by any paint supplier you prefer to complete the approval process.

In beginning the process of paint color selection, a new sequence of approval steps will be required. The new request form should be available shortly. Utilizing the PPB will still require ACC approval. Requests for deviation from

the PPB will be considered on a case by case basis and ultimately may require full Board approval, thus potentially delaying the process.

Each submission for exterior paint approval will need to include a sample of how the selected colors will appear upon your home. This is easily accomplished by utilizing a professional tool available at www.SnapYourColors.com. The tool enables you to upload an exact photograph of your home and add in the proposed colors for easy viewing. A proposed colorized full page picture will be required with each application. Homeowners may certainly choose any painter

or paint supplier they wish; however, the tool rendering the proposed colors, is specific to one vendor. The colors being submitted must match the actual product to be applied.

This new PPB and the color tool will help our neighbors have more direction and assistance in the planning phase and should help streamline the approval process. Thank you for your patience in this transition and the substantial effort to protect the value of our individual homes and maximize the ability for personalization.

PACKAGE THEFT PREVENTION TIPS



- Request a <u>specific delivery date and time</u> from the shipper when you know you will be home
- Have packages delivered to a place where they can be <u>received in</u> <u>person</u>, such as the home of a <u>trusted neighbor</u>, who stays home during the day
- Request that the shipper <u>hold your package</u> at Its pick-up facility so you can pick it up in person at your convenience
- Provide <u>delivery instructions</u> to the shipper so that packages can be left at a safe location at your home that is <u>out of sight from the street</u>
- If your employer will allow it, <u>have packages delivered to your place of</u> work
- Consider a <u>visible surveillance camera</u> and a security company sign near the front door

Attention Neighbors,

Winter Holidays will soon be here and is a time when many residents go away for vacation. There are some specific steps that you can take to help avoid becoming a victim of crime while away.

Tips to avoid becoming a victim while away on vacation:

- Have a friend pick up your mail and newspapers. You can also have the post office stop your mail while away on vacation.
- Have a neighbor take in your trashcans if left out.
- Have someone keep an eye on your house.
- You can call the Cherokee County Sheriff's Office nonemergency number 678-493-4080 and tell them you will be away and to have an officer check your house. As a community service, they will have an officer check up on your house to check your doors and the security of your home while you are away.
- Have timers set up on lights and TV.
- Stop all deliveries.
- Place valuables in a safe deposit box.
- Park unattended cars in the garage.
- Remove valuables from cars and lock the doors.
- Insure that your doors are locked.

TIPS FOR A SAFE AND HAPPY HOLIDAY

During the year-end holidays, people are often busy, excited, and some- times a little careless. The following are a series of holiday crime prevention tips that should be embraced this holiday season.

At Home:

- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave your house, even for a few minutes.
- Don't display holiday gifts where they can be seen from a window or doorway. Store gifts before you go away on a holiday trip.
- If you go out for the evening, turn on lights and a radio or television so the house or apartment appears to be occupied.
- Be wary of strangers soliciting for charitable donations. They may at-tempt to take advantage of people's generosity during the holidays. Ask for identification, how donated funds are used, if contributions are tax deductible, etc. If you aren't satisfied with the answers, don't give.
- Immediately after the holidays, mark new gifts with an identification number and record new serial numbers.
- Test your smoke detectors.
- Use only fire resistant ornaments on a holiday tree and

- make sure Electric lights are in good working order. Don't leave the lights on overnight or when you are away from home.
- If you have house guests, advise them of your security precautions and make sure they adhere to them.
- Avoid leaving boxes from purchases (especially TVs, DVD players, Computers, etc.) out on the curb for trash pickup.

Shopping:

- Shop before dark if possible. Possibly coordinate shopping trips with a friend. Never park in an unlit lot or area, no matter how convenient it is.
- Lock your packages and gifts in your vehicle's trunk. Keep your vehicle doors locked and windows closed.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Pay for purchases with a check, credit card, or debit card whenever possible.
- Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse under your arm. Keep a wallet in an inside jacket, not a back trouser pocket.
- Teach children to go to a store clerk or security guard and ask for help if you become separated. They should never go into a parking lot alone.

Lawn Tips - November/December/January

Warm Season Grasses

(Bermuda, Centipede, Zoysia, St. Augustine)

- To ensure a healthier spring lawn, mow Bermuda and Zoysia to a height of about 3 inches before dormancy. It is important that your mower blades are sharp for the last cut of the season.
- Given our unseasonably warm October, warm season turfs are not yet completely dormant in early November. Remove fallen leaves to reduce disease susceptibility,



improve airflow, and increase exposure to sunlight. Keep your lawn free from leaves throughout the season.

- Identify weeds in your turf, and spot treat with a selective post-emergent herbicide, targeted for your specific turf.
- When soil temperatures are consistently at or below 70 degrees, consider applying a fungicide to prevent spring fungal disease.
- In order to prepare for spring success, it is a great time to take soil samples, especially in problem areas.
- If you have overseeded with fescue, maintain a regular watering schedule.
 Consider the amount of rainfall when setting irrigation. It is also time to apply a post-emergent herbicide.

Cool Season Lawns

 $(Tall\ Fescue,\ Kentucky\ Bluegrass)$

- Cool season turf is entering its vigorous growth phase.
- Proper mowing height is 2.5 to 3 inches.
- Aerate and overseed fescue to patch thinning or bald spots in November. Spot spray visible weeds with a selective post-emergent herbicide.
- You may still fertilize Tall Fescue turf in November. Conduct a soil test
 to determine how much fertilizer and/or lime is needed. Follow the soil
 test's fertilizer and lime application recommendations. Avoid fertilizing
 or liming in December and January.

- Unless you overseeded, turf may not need regular irrigation.
- Although the best time to install new cool season turf or sprigs is October, Tall Fescue may be planted in November. Keep it moist until established, and then reduce irrigation to 1 inch per week.



Remember! Apply de-icing salts carefully, especially to sidewalk and driveway areas adjacent to turf!





Fall Fire Safety

EDITH

We would like to encourage every family to practice home escape plans and know where your meeting place will be. The acronym EDITH stands for Exit Drills in the Home. This is vital for all who live in your homes. Having two ways out of each room and knowing where you are going to meet when you get out to assure all have exited. Practice the plan with members of the family. Children as young as 3 can follow an escape plan if they have practiced it often. Teach your children not to hide when they encounter fire — not even if they have started it. Firefighters in protective gear can look frightening. Take them to a fire station to see and to meet firemen and learn that they are friends and come to help.



Smoke Alarms / Detectors

Having working smoke alarms (detectors) and testing them monthly will increase your survival rate. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) states that in every 3 out of 5 fire deaths there were no smoke alarms or ones that were not working. Parents should install an alarm on

each level of the home and outside bedrooms or other sleeping areas. Remember to test alarms monthly and change batteries at least once a year — preferably twice, at biannual time changes. If an infant sleeps in a separate room, place an alarm in the room. Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.



Grilling and Fire Pits

When lighting your grill/pit, be sure that there are no leaks.

If you smell gas, turn the grill off and have the problem repaired.

Always open the lid of the grill before lighting.

Never leave the grill/pit unattended.

Keep the grill/pit away from the house and deck railings.

Maintain at least three feet of clearance for children and pets.

Always remember to turn your grill off and the gas to it when finished.

Always extinguish the fire pit when finished.



Fall Burning

When burning outdoors, please remember to obtain a burn permit through Georgia Forestry at 1-877-OK2-BURN (652-2876) or online at www.gatrees.org/onlinepermits. There are some ordinances that you need to be aware of as well.

There is no burning allowed on Sunday's or at night.

The fire needs to be attended to at all times.

Piles should be kept small and only burn what is in your yard.

No trash or building supplies are allowed to be burned.

Woodstock proper is within the metro burning ban from May 1st through October 1st every year, which bans all outdoor burning.




Towne Lake Hills Tennis Club Aces

DON'T GET SO WORKED UP

A good way of reminding a player to not get too worked up over making mistakes is to constantly remind him or her that the last point and the last shot should be left in the past. It is the next point that matters now. It helps to get the player in the right frame of mind. When the mind is in the moment, a player will be able to summon his or her best tennis. This brings up the next important thing in developing mental toughness in tennis, which is focus.

Focus is the ability to pay attention to things that matter, things that will bring results while at the same time ignoring or simply accepting and dealing with things that cannot be controlled.

3 PROVIDENCE CANYON, Georgia's

"Little Grand Canyon," is a testament to the power of man's influence on the land. Massive gullies as deep as 150 feet were caused simply by poor farming practices during the 1800s, yet today

they make some of the prettiest photographs within the state.

Visitors can enjoy views of the canyons from the rim trail, taking care to stay behind fences and off the fragile canyon edge. Hikers who explore the deepest canyons will usually find a thin layer of water along the trail, indication of the water table below. Backpackers can stay overnight along the backcountry trail which highlights portions of the canyon and winds through mixed forest. Camping, cottages and efficiency units are available nearby.

ecological and environmental park. Although swimming is no longer allowed in the spring, it served that purpose for many years and once was one of Georgia's most popular resort areas, in part due to an unexpected discovery in the early 20th century. Testing revealed that the water flowing from the spring contained traces of radium, a chemical element 1,000 more times radioactive than uranium. It occurs naturally in certain types of earth and is extremely rare. Uniquely, it is luminescent and glows in a faint blue color. The originally named Blue Springs, was then renamed Radium Springs as the first step toward its development as a resort. The park features a restored terrace, new sidewalks,

STONE MOUNTAIN is well-known not only for its

geology, but also for the enormous rock relief on its north face—the largest bas-relief in the world—depicting three Confederate figures during the Civil War: Stonewall Jackson, Robert E.

Davis. More than five miles in circumference at its base, Stone Mountain Park features 15 miles of hiking and walking trails. If you're looking for a little adventure, take the 1 mile trek to the top of the mountain. Just

follow the painted yellow line and enjoy the unique scenery. While on top, 1,686 feet above sea level, you're provided with amazing views of downtown Atlanta, the North Georgia mountains and the surrounding area.

TALLULAH GORGE, at

two miles long and nearly 1,000 feet deep, is one of the most spectacular canyons in the eastern US. Visitors can hike rim trails to several overlooks, or they can obtain a permit to hike to the gorge floor (limited to 100 per day). A suspension bridge sways 80 feet above the rocky bottom, providing spectacular views of the river and waterfalls. Tightrope walkers have twice crossed the gorge, and visitors can still see towers used by Karl Wallenda. A paved path follows an on old railroad bed, while mountain bikers can test their skills on a challenging 10-mile trail. Exhibits in the park's Jane Hurt Yarn Interpretive Center highlight the rich history of this Victorian resort town, as well as the rugged terrain and fragile ecosystem of the

area. The persistent trillium, monkey-face orchid and green salamander are protected species found within the gorge.


